Comptroller Lierman Recognizes Business Owners and Community Organizations During Inaugural AAPI Heritage Awards

Fifteen recipients honored with Community Champion and Public Service Awards for their impact in Maryland

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (May 28, 2025) — Maryland Comptroller Brooke E. Lierman today presented the inaugural AAPI Heritage Awards to 15 Asian American and Pacific Islander business owners and community leaders for their contributions to the State of Maryland and the business community during an Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month event at the Louis L. Goldstein Treasury Building in Annapolis.

During her remarks, Comptroller Lierman noted that more than 420,000 Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders live in Maryland, and the state has over 14,000 Asianowned firms that employ more than 118,000 people.

"The AAPI communities in Maryland are culturally rich, help drive economic activity, and serve as sources of leadership to strengthen our state. You uplift and enrich our communities, solidifying Maryland as a culturally rich place where everyone is welcome to live, raise a family, start a business, and thrive. We are proud to support and celebrate you," Comptroller Lierman shared.

The Public Service Award was presented to organizations and individuals who have created or advocated for sustainable advancement in the AAPI community.
