Comptroller's Office to Relocate Baltimore County Branch Office

New location to offer expanded services and greater accessibility for taxpayers

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (October 8, 2025) — The Maryland Office of the Comptroller will open a new branch office in Baltimore County later this month, relocating from Towson to Windsor Mill.

The new office, located at 3104 Lord Baltimore Drive, Suite 100, offers ground-floor access, ample free parking, accessibility by MTA bus, and convenient proximity to I-695 (Baltimore Beltway). The agency selected this site to offer improved accessibility, visibility, and modern amenities for taxpayers. The final day for services in the Towson Branch Office will be Tuesday, October 14. The new location in Windsor Mill will open on Monday, October 20, 2025.

"We want to make it easier for more residents in the Baltimore-area to access our services and the move to Windsor Mill will enhance our ability to serve Marylanders," **Comptroller Brooke E. Lierman** said. "This new location provides the convenience and comfort Marylanders deserve in a central location, while allowing our skilled staff to deliver the high-quality service they expect."

Last fiscal year, the Towson Branch Office assisted 10,554 taxpayers with tax questions, tax preparation, payment plans, MVA Certifications, and provided bilingual assistance for Spanish-speakers.

"This new location is a reflection of our continued commitment to the community and meeting Marylanders where they are," said **Ana Garay, Director of the Taxpayer Services Division**. "Our dedicated team looks forward to working in our new space and helping more people with their tax needs."

Walk-in assistance will be available in the Windsor Mill Office for select services, including:

Maryland state tax forms and/ or tax booklets.

- Answer general tax questions.
- Accept completed Maryland tax returns and/or requested documents.
- Provide additional IFTA decals to carriers in good standing and new carriers whose application have been approved.
- Certified copies of previously filed Maryland tax returns for an individual with identification.

All other services require an appointment, which can be made online.

Taxpayers seeking tax assistance in Baltimore County during the transition can visit any of the agency's 10 <u>other branch offices</u> or schedule a virtual appointment by visiting <u>www.marylandcomptroller.gov</u>.
