Maryland Comptroller to Relocate Branch Office from Cecil County to Harford County in 2026

New Bel Air Location to open in February; agency to expand virtual appointment access

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (December 23, 2025) — The Comptroller of Maryland announced that it will relocate its branch office from Cecil County to Harford County in 2026.

The last day for in-person branch office services at the current Elkton branch office will be December 31, 2025. The new branch office, located at 1904 Emmorton Road in Bel Air is scheduled to open early to mid-February next year due to construction delays. The new location offers ground-floor access, ample free parking, is conveniently located near I-95, and modern amenities for taxpayers.

The Elkton Branch Office has assisted nearly 5,000 taxpayers this calendar year, and the agency expects to serve even more taxpayers by relocating to a more central location.

“Relocating to Harford County will allow us to meet more taxpayers where they are by reducing the time and distance they must travel to get to us,” Comptroller Brooke E. Lierman said of the relocation. “We continue to seek out more opportunities to make government work better for Maryland taxpayers and provide greater accessibility to our resources and services. Opening new and more modern branch locations in 2026 is an important element in that work.”

Ahead of the new branch opening, branch office employees will be available to work with taxpayers virtually by appointment, and the agency will expand its virtual appointment offerings.

“Our commitment to customer service is unrelenting. Whether someone reaches us in-person, online, or by phone, the Taxpayer Service Division aims to provide timely, accurate, and quality support to taxpayers across Maryland and beyond,” Ana Garay, director of the Taxpayer Services Division, said. “We look forward to better serving our customers and welcoming them to a new branch office in Harford County in the new year.”

In addition to making virtual appointments, taxpayers can also visit any of the agency’s 10 other branch offices across the state or submit an inquiry through the MyCOMConnect portal.

The agency also expects to relocate its offices in Frederick County and Montgomery County next year.
