COMMUTER BUS CONTRACTS

The BPW approved a request from the Maryland Transit Administration to award Atlantic Coast Charters, Inc. (Linthicum, MD) and Keller Transportation, Inc. (Waldorf, MD) three contracts to provide and operate **Commuter Bus services for Routes** 505, 705, and 715/725. The fivevear contracts were awarded at a combined cost of \$34.9 million.

Route 505, which operates between Hagerstown and Shady Grove/Rock Spring, will be serviced by Atlantic Coast Charters, while Routes 705 (Charlotte Hall/Waldorf - DC) and 715/725 (Charlotte Hall/Waldorf - DC) will be serviced by Keller Transportation.

EXPANDING RECREATION IN CAROLINE COUNTY

The BPW approved a request from Caroline County to commit \$694,950 in Program Open Space Local Share funding to plan, design and construct new improvements at Sharp Road Park in Denton.

The improvements, which are intended to help enhance access to county field space and time, include: baseball and softball fields with irrigation, dugouts, backstop and lighting, a small soccer field, parking with ADA access, and signage.

Summary Figures

The BPW approved 101 items, representing a total State expenditure of \$180.9 million, including:

- 11 items awarding \$21.6 million to prime certified small businesses.
- 6 items awarding \$12.3 million to certified Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) primes.
- 13 items awarded with established participation goals for MBEs.
- 3 items awarded with a goal for Veteran-owned small businesses.
- 2 items awarding \$3.4 million to **Employement Works Providers**

CROWN CORK & SEAL REDEVELOPMENT IN **BALTIMORE**

The BPW approved a request from the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) to lend \$5 million in general obligation bond proceeds through the Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW) Program to Crown Cork Redevelopment, LLC for the acquisition and redevelopment of the historic Crown Cork & Seal campus in Southeast Baltimore.

DHCD's NBW Program provides flexible financing to new or expanding Maryland-based small businesses, local development corporations and nonprofit organizations in Sustainable Communities and Priority Funding Areas whose activities contribute to a broader revitalization effort.

The NBW funding for this project will be used to support acquisition costs and interior improvements, including new studio buildout and modernization of existing tenant space.
